Fly Masks

As we head into summer the first thing I think of besides the heat are bugs! Horses need protection so in my tack room you'll find an entire arsenal of supplies to launch an attack against them. I have a wide variety of bug sprays, some work better than others, and some do not work well at all. My favorites are Solitude and Endure. In the barn I use everything from stable sprays, and every fly catcher known to man. Fans also help push the flies around and give the horses some relief. I have a couple of horses that are so skin sensitive to bug bites that I have had to

invest in mesh fly sheets to cover their bodies. They have wide belly bands so the horses cannot get them off when out in the field and they work very well. Some will have co-coordinating neck and face protection also. One of the most important parts of the arsenal is our fly mask collection. Fly masks are a great asset to any horse's wardrobe. I have a large assortment consisting of many brands and styles. They provide useful protection

from the sun's harmful rays and keep pesky bugs and insects away from their eyes. Fly masks can also be useful if your horse has an eye injury and can also be worn on very windy days when there is risk of dirt or debris flying around.

Have a great summer season and I hope you find an easy solution to help keep bugs away!

Clipping your horse for summer

Summer months can be very hot and grueling for miniature horses so it is best to bathe and clip them at least once, especially the horses that do not shed out completely. If your horses are out all the time it is best not to take them down too short as they will burn and also be eaten by bugs. If you do decide to clip short please put a sheet on your horse or put them up during the

hottest part of the day to protect them. A size 5 blade is perfect to get that winter fuzz off yet keep enough hair for protection. If you do not bathe your horse first your blades will get dull very quickly. Always cut your horses hair against the grain for a clean smooth clip.
